Content

This course leads to a FETAC Level 5 minor award in Ceramic design. The award covers the basic concepts of ceramic design and production. Students will be provided with skills to create ceramic artefacts. For assessment purposes students will prepare and present a project which best expresses their ceramic skills.

The key learning outcomes of the Ceramics module include:

- Experimentation with a range of ceramic materials and processes.
- Production of test pieces, both formal and decorative in nature.
- Samples of glaze firing.
- Supporting research in the form of drawing or study models or photographic investigations.
- Production of student originated project.

Teaching methodologies

Teaching methodologies include:

- Practical demonstrations.
- Constructive feedback on project work.
- Opportunities for self-directed learning

Assessment

Students are required to produce a portfolio of coursework for assessment. This will consist of artwork, craftwork and supporting drawings or appropriate research evidence. The teacher will advise students of the type of evidence required and the submission criteria.

- Programme delivered by experienced pottery/ceramics teacher.
- Opportunities for creative expression and craftwork.

Entry Requirements

Applications are invited from the following:

- Preferred level of entry of FETAC Level 4, Leaving Certificate or equivalent qualifications and/or relevant life and work experience.
- Applicants with an interest in acquiring skills in practical craft and pottery making.

Additional requirements include:

- Completion of a part-time 20 hour Pottery course is advisable for those without previous experience or knowledge.

Application Procedures

Applicants will be offered an induction interview. To apply please present for interview. Interviews will take place at enrolment. This will take place prior to the commencement of the course. Enrolment schedule can be found in this profile.
