

# BSc (Hons) in Integrative Counselling & Psychotherapy

Blended learning means students learn via electronic and online media as well as face-to-face teaching. Some classes will occur online in real time, and some classes will occur face to face. Usually there is in the region of half and half face-to-face and online classes.

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# **Options for Attendance**

**Block:** This means that teaching is provided one weekend a month, rotating between on campus and online weekends. Weekend classes occur at the following times: Friday evening, 6pm – 9pm/10pm; Saturday 9am-5pm and Sunday, 9am-5pm.

**Weekday:** This means that teaching is provided one weekday each week, approximately half of classes held on campus, face-to-face, and half online, via Zoom.

Weekday classes occur at the following times: 10am-4pm/5pm.

Weekday options are available on Tuesday or Saturday.

**Attendance requirement: 85%** 







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#### Information about Fees and Costs

Application Fee: €75 (non-refundable)

Annual programme fee: €3,875.00

Deposit: €1,162.50.

The deposit is due within 3 weeks of receipt of your official offer.

Following payment of the deposit, the balance of the course fees are due 2 weeks before the start date of the programme. Alternativley, you can sign up for a payment plan by Direct Debit.

The Direct Debit scheme incurs a €50 administration fee.

#### **Additional Costs**

(Programme Requirements not covered in programme fee)

Personal Therapy: 50 hours must be completed with a therapist who is an accredited member of IACP/IAHIP/BACP.

Individual Clinical Supervision: 24 hours must be completed with a supervisor who is an accredited supervisor with IACP/IAHIP/BACP.

Group Therapy: 10 sessions must be completed in third/fourth year of the BSc.

IACP Membership: Student Membership must be obtained before clinical work commences.

Professional Indemnity Insurance: Must be in place before clinical work commences.

IICP understand that while partaking in further education is an incredibly rewarding experience it can also be a financial challenge for some students. In order to minimise the financial impact caused to students, IICP strive to keep our course fees as competitive as possible. We also provide payment plan options to facilitate learners paying the balance of their fees throughout the duration of their course.



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# **Standard Entry Route:**

#### You must satisfy the following requirements for standard entry:

- Applicants must have obtained a pass in six subjects at Ordinary/ Foundation Level or Higher in their Leaving Certificate.
- Alternatively, applicants must have obtained a full award recognised at Level 5 or higher on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). A full award may be accumulated over more than one academic year.
- Where English is a second language applicants are required to submit an IELTS (International English Language Testing System) cert at Level 6, or equivalent.
- As this programme is professionally validated and includes a clinical practice component, applicants will be invited to attend for interview prior to entry.



# **Indirect Entry Route:**

#### **Recognition of Prior Learning:**

Applicants who do not qualify for the standard entry route, may gain admission or exemptions/credit from some parts of a programme, based on demonstrated learning that they may have achieved through another programme of study, or through work or other learning experiences.



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# **Requirements for the Programme**

- Travel to scheduled face-to-face classes (Public Health Guidelines permitting).
- For the class days that you will be required to travel, the College building is in Tallaght, Dublin 24, close to major bus routes, the LUAS, and three local hotels.
- Access to a stable internet connection with a minimum download speed of 1.5 Mbps.
- A desktop computer or laptop that is capable of using zoom.
- A webcam and microphone.
- · A web browser.
- · Microsoft Word.

# **Requirements for Registration**

In order to register, students must create an IICP eNROL account here <a href="https://mit.enrol.ie/iicp/">https://mit.enrol.ie/iicp/</a> on our student management system. Your student account will then need to be populated as follows:

- PPSN QQI utilise the PPSN as a unique identifier on their certification system and therefore you are required to provide your PPSN in your student account. If you do not have a PPSN, please contact the admissions team.
- **Digital Photo** You are required to upload a digital photo on your profile. This is used for your student card and for our virtual learning environment (VLE), Moodle.
- Car Details If you are planning to drive to IICP College, we require that you provide your car make, model, colour and registration.
- Next of Kin Details Please update the system with your next of kin details. Please note, these would only ever be used in case of emergencies.
- Curriculum Vitae & Supporting Documentation You should ensure that an up-to-date CV, along with any documentation to support your application and suitability for the programme, are uploaded to your student account.
