Micro-credentials are a new and exciting academic offering from Trinity College. They are short, accredited learning experiences that facilitate flexible and innovative professional development and lifelong learning.

Is it for me?

This micro-credential will be relevant to all intellectual disability service providers and professionals who wish to develop competency and knowledge in respect of the enactment of human rights in the day-to-day lives of people with intellectual disabilities.

What does it cover?

The micro-credential will equip learners with the necessary knowledge, skills, attitudes and competencies to enact rights-oriented service and person-centred support to people with intellectual disabilities in line with the The United Nations Convention on Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD).

How is it delivered?

This micro-credential is delivered in a blended format. Learners will take part in three x 3-hour in-person workshops, and benefit from a mix of live and recorded lectures. Online resources will be available to students to facilitate flexible self-directed study.

- Demonstrate knowledge of the role of the service and service personnel in enacting person-centred supports for people with intellectual disabilities.
